Basic Life and AD&D - Hartford Life (thehartford.com)

Life insurance is provided in an amount equal to 1.5 times your basic annual earnings, to a maximum of \$350,000. accidental death and dismemberment is included, as well.

Long Term Disability - Hartford Life

Disability coverage is provided for each employee. This policy will pay you a percentage of your earnings should you become disabled and unable to work. The benefit begins after an elimination period of 180 days. Coverage provides income protection to replace 60% of your earnings to a maximum of \$10,000 per month.

Supplemental Life and AD&D - Hartford Life

You may purchase additional Life Insurance for yourself in increments of \$10,000 during the first 90 days of employment. If you decide to purchase additional Life Insurance after your first 90 days, you will be required to submit medical evidence with your application. The maximum amount you may purchase is 5 times your annual earnings to a maximum of \$500,000. The first \$150,000 is a guarantee issue; additional amounts will require medical evidence.

If you purchase Supplement Life Insurance, you may also purchase Life for your spouse or domestic partner in increments of \$5,000 to a maximum of \$25,000 or 50% of your own Supplemental Life coverage. Additionally, you can purchase \$10,000 of Life insurance for your children through the age of 26.





The park is famous for its giant sequoia trees, including the General Sherman tree, one of the largest trees on Earth. The General Sherman tree grows in the Giant Forest, which contains five out of the ten largest trees in the world. The Giant Forest is connected by the Generals Highway to Kings Canyon National Park's General Grant Grove, home to the General Grant tree among other giant sequoias. The park's giant sequoia forests are part of 202,430 acres of old-growth forests shared by Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks. Indeed, the parks preserve a landscape that still resembles the southern Sierra Nevada before Euro-American settlement.



The San Joaquin Valley has been called “The food basket of the world.” Grapes, raisins, and to a lesser extent wine, are perhaps the valley's highest-profile product, but equally (if not more) important are cotton, nuts (especially almonds and pistachios), citrus, and vegetables.

Cattle and sheep ranching are also vitally important to the valley's economy. During the late 19th century and early 20th century, the Miller & Lux corporation built an agricultural monopoly centered around cattle.



Half Dome, Yosemite National Park



Take the Half Dome challenge and go for an exciting, arduous hike. Most would say the reward is worth the effort. Along the way, you'll see outstanding views of Vernal and Nevada Falls, Liberty Cap, Half Dome, and--from the shoulder and summit--panoramic views of Yosemite Valley and the High Sierra.

Yosemite is internationally recognized for its spectacular granite cliffs, waterfalls, clear streams, giant sequoia groves, and biological diversity.

Yosemite is one of the largest and least fragmented habitat blocks in the Sierra Nevada, and the park supports a diversity of plants and animals. The park has an elevation range from 2,127 to 13,114 feet.

Warm springs, hot summers, dry falls and wet winters give these regions near-perfect weather for producing optimum quality and yield (the amount of cotton produced per acre). The San Joaquin Valley, California's primary growing area, is very well-suited to growing cottons that are difficult to produce.

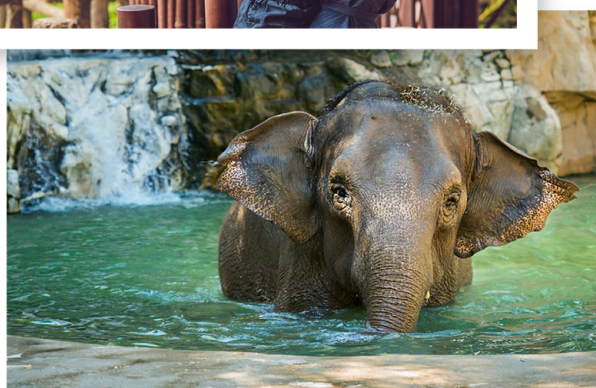
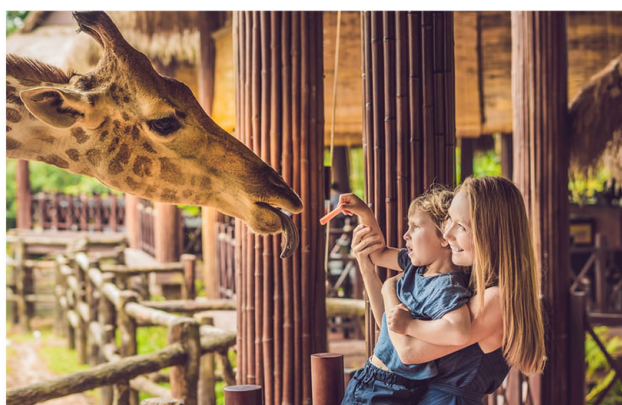
The World famous Venice Beach Boardwalk is not to be missed. If you are visiting the Los Angeles area, you owe it to yourself to come to Southern California's number one visitor attraction. 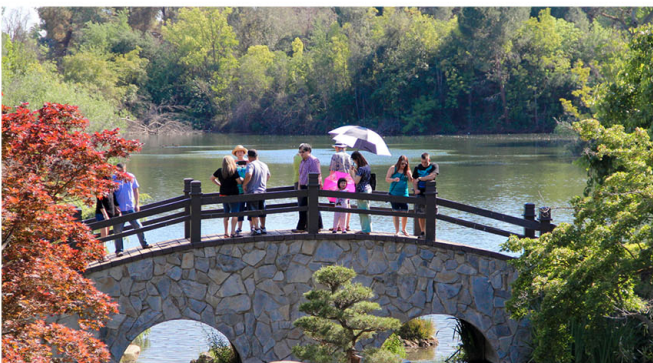


The Fresno Chaffee Zoo is a zoo in Roeding Park in Fresno, California covering 39 acres and housing over 190 species. Fresno Chaffee Zoo is the Central Valley's destination for "wild" adventure. Visit the animals in habitats created to mimic their own including a tropical rain forest. You can take in a bird show, feed the giraffes or chat with the keepers. The Chaffee Zoo is also proud of their new Sea Lion Cove exhibit, modeled after Central California's Coast Point Lobos. The cove will give you an up-close and once in a life time experience with the unique sea lions.

Other attractions include Stingray Bay, Dino Dig, Valley Farm, African Adventure, and Ross Laird's Winged Wonders Bird Show.



Woodward Park, Fresno, CA

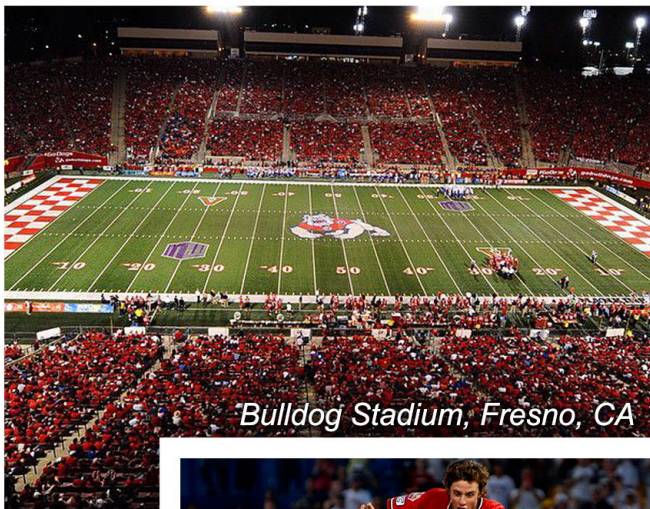

Fresno Grizzlies at Chukchansi Park



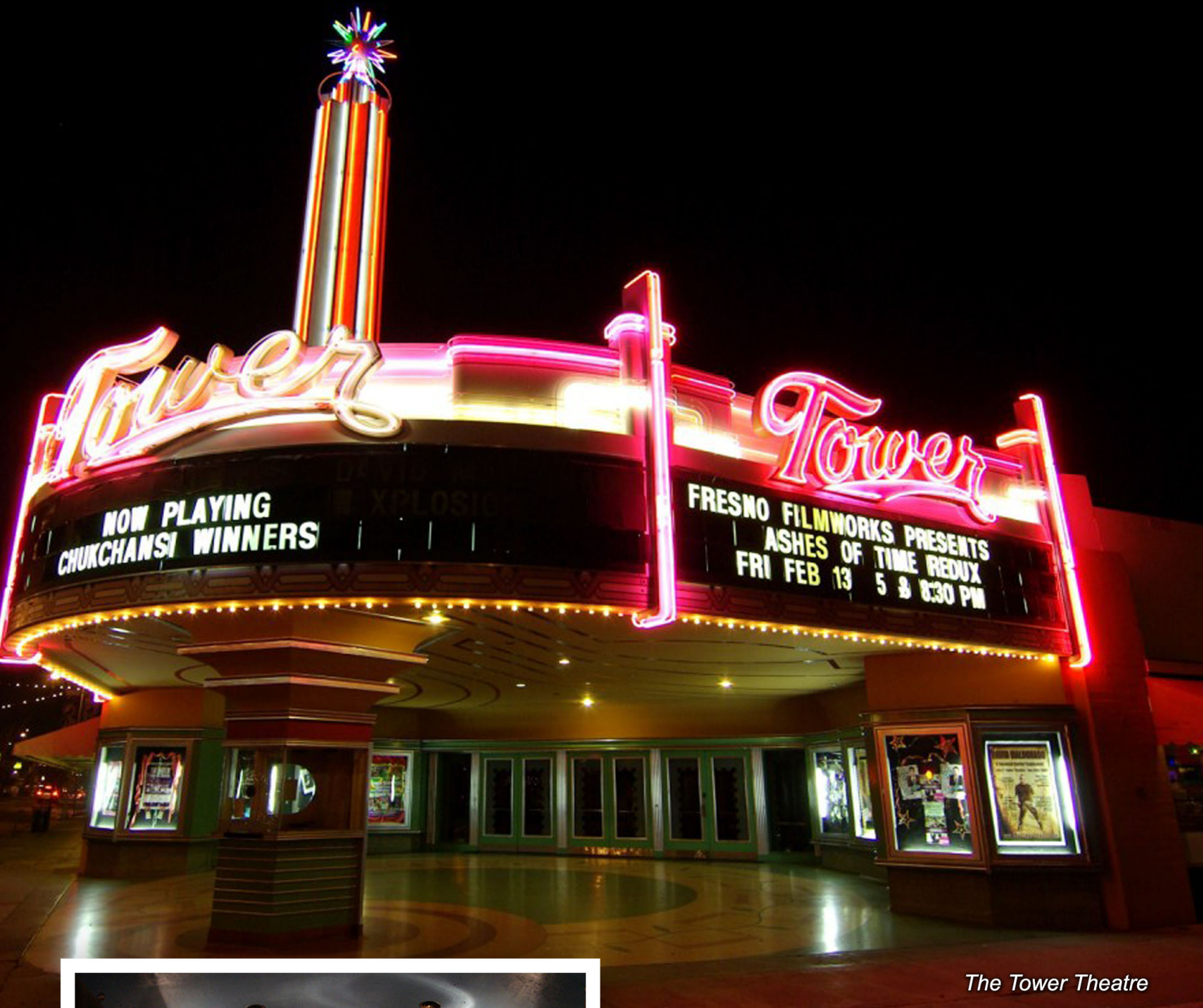

The Tower Theatre



The crown jewel of Fresno's hottest nightlife neighborhood, the Tower Theatre lends its name to an area which has been a community focus of arts and entertainment for generations.

Opened in 1939 as a 20th Century Fox Movie House the theater was restored in 1990 and reopened as a center for the performing arts. In 1992, the theatre was placed on the National Register of Historic Places. Considered to be the finest facility of its kind in California, the Tower Theatre boasts an authentic art deco theme throughout the interior and exterior.



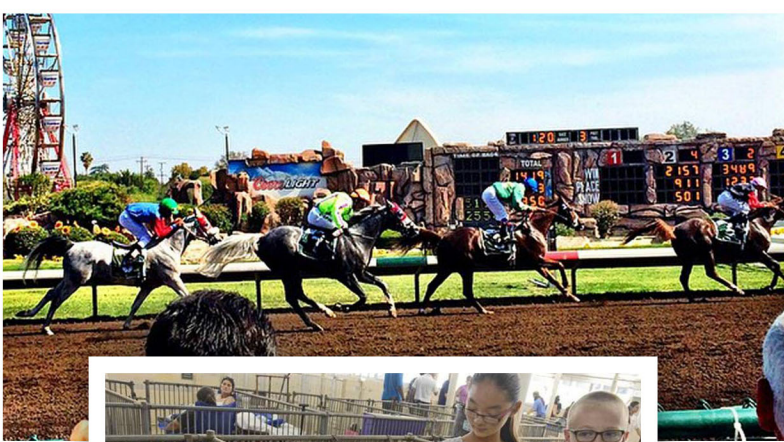
California Memorial Museum

The California Memorial Museum displays hundreds of items donated from the FDNY, NYPD and Port Authority Police Department to Pelco Chairman David McDonald following the attacks of Sept. 11. This unique collection includes an American flag flown by the FDNY at Ground Zero.

African-American Cultural and Historical Museum of the San Joaquin Valley

This museum was opened in 1993 and hosts rotating and permanent displays concerning African-American history and culture. The museum's mission is to celebrate and promote the richness of African and African-American history, art and culture in the Central San Joaquin Valley through exhibition, theater, music and education.





The Big Fresno Fair is one of Fresno's biggest and longest running events. Whether you like food, games, rides, shows, exhibits, or all of the above, The Big Fresno Fair has it all!

In addition to being the site of the annual Fair, the Fresno Fairgrounds serves as a year-round rental facility that spans 165 acres held under a 50-year lease with the County of Fresno.
