In our 52-year history, there have been many great milestones making a tremendous impact on the health and wellness of the Central Valley. Not unlike previous years, the milestones of 2023 were strategically planned by an experienced Board of Directors and a team of exceptional leaders who methodically executed the planning to benefit over 160,000 unique patients. In 2023 we added many new specialty services including cardiology, gastroenterology, orthopedics, nephrology, gynecology, urology, vascular health, and sleep medicine. We also continued to bring essential services to several new communities, including Visalia for the first time and two additional locations in Fresno with a new comprehensive health center on Ashlan Avenue and a Vision Services Center downtown on "S" Street

To accompany the new services, UHC grew its employee base by 125 new hires including 45 key clinical staff as well as two officers, two directors, seven health center managers, and various specialists. The two new officers provide direct support to the President and CEO: Faith Driscoll, Esq., UHC's Chief Legal Officer, oversees Human Resources and provides essential consulting on legal and strategic initiatives while overseeing the training and development of our excellent workforce of 1,200+ individuals. Navjot Singh was named Contracting and Managed Care Officer for the United Physicians Network (UPN), a specialty network and one of the largest Independent Physician Associations (IPA) in the Central Valley. To date, UPN has incorporated over 2,076 contracted providers and 183 organizations—a remarkable achievement within Navjot's first year in this position.



Among new clinical positions, Dr. Sharareh Shabafrooz was promoted to Associate Medical Director for Medical Education to oversee the various Post-Grad and Pre-Grad Residency Programs. UHC's Medical Education Program is comprised of nearly 50 coaches/mentors that assist with the training of more than 165 future clinicians annually. Another key director is Candice Clem, Director of Philanthropy, who will oversee UHC Foundation fundraising events including the Spring Gala, the Summer Fun Run (new in 2023) and the Annual Golf Tournament now held at Eagle Springs Golf and Country Club. In addition, Ms. Clem will generate revenue through major gift pledges and donations supporting the Dr. Shankerman Scholarship Program and the ever-increasing costs of comprehensive healthcare services and facility construction.

As I reflect on all the important achievements we have made in just one year, I still find it quite remarkable how new services quickly reach their capacity and that we still have far to go to fulfill the tremendous demand for quality and accessible healthcare in the underserved areas of our vast Central Valley. With the aid of social media and electronic web-based patient appointments along with dozens of new community partnerships, we can quickly reach multitudes unlike any time in our history. These advancements and growth are thanks to the outstanding work of our new health center managers and the great work of our award-winning creative team and their communication services.

Through my 19 years with UHC (and now in my first year as President and CEO), I have been fortunate to know that the true strength of our organization continues to rely on the outstanding support of our compassionate and dedicated staff. I was delighted to see the return of the UHC Holiday Gala at Table Mountain Casino with nearly 1,000 guests. I also greatly enjoyed our quarterly recognition lunches, as well as witnessing the highly prized softball trophy come back to where it belongs.

The road ahead remains a challenge as we face constant variables in national economics and policies; however, with outstanding strategic planning from our exceptional Board of Directors, we are well-prepared and confident for 2024 and beyond. Several new health centers will soon open in Fresno, including sites on Jensen Avenue, California Avenue, First Street and downtown on Illinois Avenue, along with a second location on Bullard Avenue and another health center in the City of Fowler on 6th Street. These new sites along with new services coming in the near future, including Mammography screening, will be quite exciting for us all.






Five Years of Growth




Revenue Growth



Training the Next Generation & Combating Gaps in Central Valley Healthcare

Primary Care Family Practice Residency and Intern Programs

USAN Francisco (UCSF) Fresno Medical School Family Practice Physician Residency Program. This program annually graduates five third-year family practice physicians, under the leadership of Program Director Dr. Juan Ruvalcaba. Since 2015, Dr. Juan Ruvalcaba has been leading the UHC Family Practice Residency Program and has been instrumental in the retention of more than 60% of the graduates to continue practicing in the Valley.

In addition to the Family Practice Residency Program, UHC hosts a variety of other training programs, including the Physician Assistant Residency Program from California Health Sciences University and the A.T. Still University (ATSU) Central Coast Physician Assistant Training Program. UHC also supports Family Nurse Practitioner student programs from Fresno Pacific and Fresno State Universities, along with multiple other training programs across California and beyond from institutions such as The University of Texas at Arlington, California State University (CSU) Bakersfield, United States University of San Diego, CSU Dominguez Hills, Marysville University, Purdue Global University, Chamberlain University, and Walden University.

Medical Education Training Programs

At the forefront of the UHC's Medical Education Program is Dr. Sharareh Shabafrooz, Associate Medical Director for Medical Education. Dr. Shabafrooz oversees Advanced Practice Medical Practitioners in various Post-Grad and Pre-Grad residency programs. UHC's program is comprised of nearly 50 coaches and mentors who assist in training more than 165 future clinicians annually across over 30 UHC clinical training sites. By offering a comprehensive training program that includes hands-on clinical experience, mentorship from seasoned faculty, and professional development opportunities, UHC fosters strong bonds between new residents and underserved communities. As a result, the Central Valley can expect to retain up to 40% of its graduates, helping to address provider shortages and reduce barriers to healthcare access.

As a teaching healthcare organization, UHC is staffed with over 180 staff clinicians in various specialties, providing services to over 160,000 patients across Fresno, Kings, Tulare, and Kern counties. With a workforce of over 1,200 staff, UHC coordinates nearly one million appointments annually. Among UHC patients, 80% are Hispanic, 56% are migrant or seasonal farmworkers, and 75% live at or below 200% of the federal poverty level.


Quarterly Taco Appreciation Lunches



\$140,000 Donation Advances Dr. Shankerman Scholarship at Fresno State

Presenting a \$140,000 check to Fresno State Foundation



In April of 2023, the United Health Centers Foundation committed a \$140,000 gift to Fresno State University to endow the Dr. Robert Allen Shankerman Memorial Scholarship for students pursuing careers in the medical field. Later in 2023, a ceremonial check presentation was hosted at Fresno State University by Justin Preas, President & CEO, and David Phillips, Community Resource Officer, to Fresno State University representatives.

Shortly thereafter, the scholarship was uploaded into the student portal and students began the process of applying for consideration through, 2024.

The application criteria included:

- Minimum GPA of 2.54
- Must be a junior or senior
- A statement of desire to become a medical provider
- A statement of the applicant's experience with diversity and healthcare is required

19 applications were received, and the review committee will select eight students to receive \$5,000 by the close of 2024. Four candidates will be selected from the School of Science and Math, and Four candidates will be selected from the College of Health and Human Services. Awards will be disbursed to each candidate in two parts: \$2,500 in 2024, and \$2,500 in spring of 2025.

United Health Centers will have an opportunity to meet the awarded candidates during the annual spring scholarship luncheon at Fresno State in spring of 2025, which is traditionally hosted at the Smittcamp Alumni House at Fresno State.

United Health Centers Foundation is proud to celebrate Dr. Robert Shankerman's compassionate spirit and dedication to underserved regions through this scholarship, and the training and education of future health care providers and physicians the scholarship supports.
